Representative cases in which he has obtained defense verdicts include:

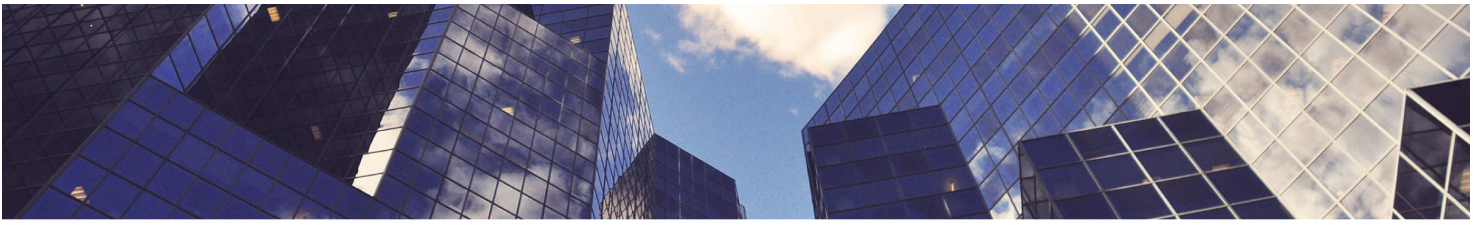
- *Gellman v Presbyterian Hospital*, a young man who suffered a severe stroke he claimed was a complication of embolization of the anterior choroidal artery performed by a leading neuro-interventional radiologist. This case was selected by *The National Law Journal* as one of the top 10 defense verdicts in the United States.
- *Mayo v. Bronx Lebanon Medical Center*, a pediatric brain damage case in Bronx County where the demand was \$3 million and no settlement offer was made.
- *Brandes v. North Shore University Hospital*, a four-month trial in Queens County involving allegations of fraud and ghost surgery.
- *Apthekar v. Schulman*, an attorney who claimed he could no longer work because his vision was impaired by a Lasik surgery performed by a well-known ophthalmologist.
- *Gomez v. BIMC*, a wrongful death of a young mother, survived by two young children, in the emergency room from anaphylactic shock after eating peanuts.

- *Duffy v. Jacobs*, a re-trial of a case involving catastrophic injuries that was reversed by the New York State Court of Appeals because the trial court refused to poll the jury after the verdict.
- *Grebko v. Maimonides Medical Center*, a Kings County wrongful death case involving a young man survived by his wife and infant daughter, who claimed premature discharge from the emergency room.
